CHILDREN BORN ABROAD <u>BEFORE</u> 13 JANUARY 2010 TO FOREIGN AND COMMONWEALTH MEMBERS OF THE UK ARMED FORCES ON AN OVERSEAS POSTING

- 1. Section 4D of the British Nationality Act 1981 came in to force on 13 January 2010. This provision gave a new registration route to those born to a parent in the armed forces. However, only those born on or after 13 January 2010 are eligible to apply for citizenship under section 4D.
- 2. The Secretary of State has therefore agreed to routinely exercise her discretion and register a child under section 3(1) of the British Nationality Act 1981 where:
 - The child was born outside the United Kingdom and the qualifying territories <u>before</u> 13 January 2010; and
 - At the time of the birth, their father or mother was:
 - i. a foreign and Commonwealth member of the UK Armed Forces; and
 - ii. serving outside the United Kingdom and the qualifying territories
 - We have the consent of both parent's; and
 - If the person is aged 10 or over on the date of application, the Secretary of State is satisfied that they are of good character
- 3. The Nationality Staff Instructions and the UKBA website are being updated. Any applications received before this guidance has been updated should be treated sympathetically in accordance with this Notice.
